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






## SPECIFIC SUPPORT: HOUSING TYPES

#### Which type of new housing would you prefer in town?






## SPECIFIC SUPPORT: NEW RESIDENTS

- Young workers







## WRITE-IN RESPONSES: COMMON CONCERNS

- "Low-income"
- Fear of taxes increasing
- Fear loss of rural character

- Fear of high density, apartments
- Fear of crime
- Fear of crowding in school



## ADDRESSING CONCERNS: WHAT IS LOW-INCOME?

- Many programs use 80% of area median income (AMI) as "lowincome" threshold, adjusted by family size
- Many young workers and working families qualify
- USDA and CHFA loans go up to 115% of AMI
  - Targeted at first-time homebuyers,
    AND counts toward 8-30g!

## **ADDRESSING CONCERNS: TAXES**

- Unless specific tax rebates are being used, AH usually assessed and taxed at market rate
  - Elisha Brook is assessed at \$749,860
- Could consider tax rebate programs for senior residents
- For specific project proposals, we can use Fiscal Impact Analysis calculators to see tax impacts on town


