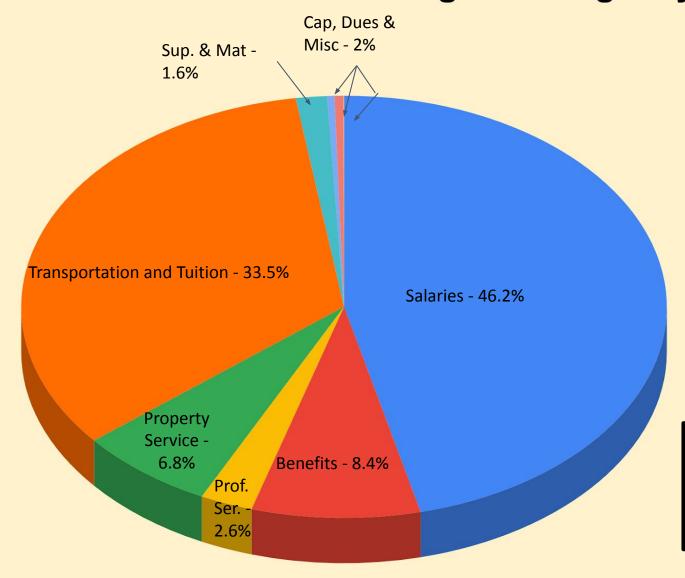

Franklin Elementary School Highlights

- 2020-21 Attendance Rate at FES to date is 97% (96% in SY2020-21)
- Less than 2% of FES students opted into remote learning to start the year (Lowest in State) and 100% of the classroom teachers returned to school in person for SY2020-21
- Grades 5-8 had the option to participate in a modified version soccer, cross country, basketball and track and field
- Franklin Elementary School began the school year in person 5 days per week compared to 39% PK-5 and 26% Gr 6-8 in Connecticut
- Student Honors based on Cumulative GPA as of June 2020: NFA SY2019-20 35/55 students (20/55 were Highest Honors, GPA over 3.667)
- Dual Enrollment, Advanced/Honors, UCONN/AP Participation: NFA SY2019-20 30/55 students
- CREDIT FULFILLMENT Count of Students: NFA SY2019-20 53/55 students or 96.4%
- Post Secondary School Attendance, NFA Class of 2020 14/16 students
- FES' current enrollment for SY2020-21 is 170; highest since 2015-16
- Year 2 of Unified Sports
- All students, K-8, have 1 to 1 devices; Funded through COVID Relief
- Reigning School Of Distinction
- Planning on two musical performances for Spring, 2021
