Let Us Pause For a Moment

Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries and memorials. Some people wear a red poppy in remembrance of those fallen in war. For 117 years our community has come together with remembrances at town memorials and cemeteries with school children marching in parade to pay their respects by bringing flowers to the graves of the many veterans that fill our cemeteries. Speeches, and voices in community song fill the air during the yearly program, all followed by a picnic lunch complete with ice cream cones and cake. Let us pause again on this upcoming Memorial Day to remember those that passed while serving the United States Military, to remember their names, to think of them, even if it is for a fleeting moment.

Private Samuel Hollis. A Black Union Soldier

Private Samuel S. Hollis of Franklin was killed on July 30th, 1864 at the Battle of the Crater. We will never know if he was killed by a Confederate minieball, artillery shell, or bayonet, or if it was an American comrade in the Crater. We can never know if he was wounded or captured, and then slaughtered. It's also possible that he was taken prisoner and enslaved or died from work and maltreatment in the Confederate army. Hollis's death should remind us about what Memorial Day stands for, and for the need to critically examine our own past. The Battle of the Crater represents one of the most tragic and heartbreaking episodes of American History. It serves to remind us that, for the Confederate rebels, the war was about the preservation of human chattel slavery. It also serves as a reminder that violent racial prejudice existed in the North. Hollis's wider life should remind us that Franklin was not, and is not, disconnected from the world. He represents cosmopolitan sailors, connected with a wider world - much like many other sailors from Franklin. He represents the struggle between freedom and slavery, and the difference in meaning that that debate had for white and black individuals. Samuel S. Hollis is a Franklin veteran like any other and should serve as a constant reminder of the struggles of so many to even be recognized as human beings, let alone citizens.






